Message from the Head Teacher

Dear Parents,

Today is the last day of term 1 - it has flown by in a happy and productive whirl! Term 2 begins on Monday 2nd November.

From Monday 2nd November, we will trial a change to the collecting routine as follows -

- If your only, or eldest child is in Blossom, Willow or Oak, please do not enter the school site until 3:00pm. Your child/ren will be dismissed between 3:00 – 3:05pm.
- If your only, or eldest child is in Redwood, please do not enter the school site until 3:10pm. Your child/ren will be dismissed between 3:10 3:15pm.
- Children who use the after school club at Busy Bees will continue to be dismissed at 3:15pm
- All parents are reminded to exit the site promptly, and politely requested not to gather on the pavement to allow as much social distancing as possible.
- If you arrive at school by car, please depart as promptly as possible to allow other parents to find a car parking space.

Thank you for your continued cooperation with our safety measures, including to all those who helped Parents' Evening to run smoothly last night. Despite the facemasks, screens and social distancing, we do hope that meeting your child's teacher was a positive experience. The second Parents' Evening is tonight. Cricket coaching with Wiltshire Cricket will continue, with indoor adaptations to the skills' coaching if the weather is too wet or cold to be outside. Blossom class will also have a cricket coaching session on Thursdays in Term 2; we have worked with Wiltshire Cricket to include skills' coaching appropriate for Reception pupils. All pupils should arrive at school on Thursdays in correct PE kit, including plain black joggers and tops.

It gives me great pleasure to announce that Rachel and Riley H have been appointed as our Head Girl and Boy. I know you will join me in congratulating Rachel and Riley on their achievement. Look out for them on the driveway after half term, when their first important job will be raising funds for The Royal British Legion.
