With parents as Governors to remind us and as parents and grandparents on the Governing Board, we really do understand that juggling home learning with working at home or working in critical roles has been a huge ask of all parents. Please do take time over the Half term break to congratulate yourselves on what you have achieved, whether it is keeping heads down and achieving all the tasks set for 3 or 4 hours of the day or whether it is small blocks of 10 minute, tasks, or even whether it is just taking time to play with and enjoy time with your children.
