Message from the Head Teacher

Dear Parents,

It is always a pleasure to appoint positions of responsibility to pupils in our school. I know that you will join me in congratulating our new Head Girl and Head Boy, **Daisy and Zachary**, and their Deputies, **Brooke and Riley**. Congratulations to you all!

Badge holders in our school are role models. They model full participation in all aspects of school life, including and most particularly, respectful communication to all members of our school community. Some badge holding positions are appointed, and others are elected by the children in the school.

Year 6 pupils who wish to stand for election as House Captain must make a short speech to the school on 6th October explaining why they would make a good House Captain, and why children in their house should vote for them. The runner-up in each house will become Deputy House Captain.

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Please help to minimise crowding on the school driveway, and to ease parking on the High Street, by leaving promptly once you have collected your child. Only one adult from each household should wait on the driveway, and if you are collecting a sibling group, please do not arrive until 3:10pm. We will dismiss children without siblings before we begin to dismiss sibling groups.

We are very happy to dismiss our older children to walk home alone or to meet parents at an agreed place in the village as long as we have those instructions in writing. #### Volunteers

#### Uniform

Please ensure that items of school uniform, particularly sweatshirts and cardigans, are clearly named. If the name is written in ink please check after each wash that the name is still legible.

#### **Book Bags**

Children may bring a flat book bag to school to carry their reading book and letters. Children may also bring a named lunch box and drinks bottle. We do not have sufficient space to store rucksacks and these must not be sent into school. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### **PE and Sport**

All pupils should arrive at school in correct PE kit on PE days. Please contact your child's teacher if you are unsure of the days for your child's PE lessons. We hope that a wider range of School Games events will be possible this year. Pupils in KS2 should have a purple competition polo shirt to wear to outside events. We have a small number of purple polo shirts to lend, please enquire at the school office.

#### Clubs

Chapmanslade School hopes to provide all children with the opportunity to take part in extra-curricular activities through the course of the year. Due to staffing levels, all teachers have lunchtime supervisory responsibilities, which means we are unable to run lunchtime clubs at the moment. We shall keep this under review. Participation in after-school football and rugby was lower than usual last term, and it has not been possible to offer those clubs during Term 1. We are keen to offer after-school sports clubs during Term 2 and would be pleased to hear from any provider who can offer a club. Please contact the school office if you are interested.

#### **Healthy Eating and Dental Care**

Oral health is now an important part of the Early Years curriculum, and schools have a new duty to promote oral health. Did you know that 1 in 5 five year olds in Wiltshire have dental decay, and that 1000 children a year in Wiltshire have teeth removed under general anaesthetic due to decay? Please help us to promote healthy happy smiles by keeping sugar consumption to meal times only. Ways to do this include:

- Encourage your child to drink water or milk only between meals
- Under 5s are eligible for free milk at school; parents of 5+ can order school milk
- Pack squash and fruit drinks in lunch boxes
- Provide a named **water** bottle for use at break and during the day (or allow school to provide fresh water for your child)
- Remember that all pupils in Blossom and Willow are provided with free fruit and vegetables for snack time in school. Do not send in anything else unless your child has a dietary intolerance.
- Pupils in Oak and Redwood should bring healthy snacks only, for example, fruit, vegetables, crackers, breadsticks, cheese, plain yoghurt.

#### Self-Isolating

It is no longer necessary for members of a household to self-isolate if one member tests positive for Covid-19. Siblings should therefore attend school whilst awaiting the results of a PCR test, even if another sibling has to remain at home due to a positive test. If a child has Covid-19, the absence is marked as sickness absence. If the child is unwell with Covid symptoms he or she is not expected to undertake remote learning.
