Dear Parents,

I fear I may have spoken too soon in my last newsletter message! Thank you for your patience as we have experienced another challenging few weeks with disruptions due to Covid-19. Thank you to parents for keeping pupils who needed to isolate at home, limiting the spread of the virus. I know that it is potentially an unsettling time for pupils with adults who they are less familiar with supporting them in their learning. I must, however, commend our wonderful pupils' resilience as they have coped very well with changes. We look forward to easier times in the coming weeks with restrictions easing and staff returning. Mrs Hobbs, our PPA teacher, returns from maternity leave next Wednesday and will resume teaching across the school on Wednesdays and Thursdays after Easter. The Queen's Platinum Jubilee - Green Canopy Project

Our Eco-keen School Councillors will be planting trees this week for the Queen's Jubilee Green Canopy Project. Lions Concert: Oak Class

Oak Class have been practising songs related to the *Heroes* theme for this year's (virtual) Lions Concert at Matravers School. The class travel to Matravers to record the songs this Thursday, 31st March. As the event will now be held virtually, the performances will take place in two ways: Matravers Radio will have an audio version of the concert which will loop continually.
