Easter.

In this unit pupils we learn:

- * about the outline of events inc:
Entry in Jerusalem; The last Supper; Jesus arrest and betrayal;
He was put on trial; He was crucified; He came back appeared to Mary Magdalene.
- * that Christians believe that Jesus is willing to forgive all people even those that put him on the cross. That Jesus did this to build a bridge between the dead he gives Christians a hope in a new life.
- * that Christians believe in life after death.
- * some of the ways its local church celebrates Easter.

Geography

We will take a look at the geography of the UK - from the physical features of mountains, rivers and seas to the man-made administrative regions and counties. We will continue to name and locate the four countries in the U.K and their capital cities.

We are beginning to use the 8 compass points to describe the location of different places.
