# Message from the Head Teacher

Dear Parents,

Another term draws to a close. This one has seemingly disappeared! For a moment, it seemed like normality had resumed, but sadly this wasn't the case. Despite that, we have achieved a wonderful amount as a school and the pupils have shown determination, persevering in their learning fantastically during a good deal of disruption. I feel we can learn a lot from our young people's resilience.

At the start of the term, we were making plans to hold an Easter Service in the church today, which would have been a lovely end to the term. With reduced practise, staffing issues and the potential risk of spreading illness before the Easter holidays, we made the difficult decision not to hold a service on this occasion. The children have been focusing on the Easter story within our Collective Worship and also RE lessons. Our Christian value this term was *perseverance* and we have particularly focused on how Jesus persevered during the events leading up to and including Holy Week. We had the pleasure of welcoming the Open the Book team into our worship this week, which helped pupils become involved in the events of Easter Sunday.

A quick update on staffing: sadly, Mrs Chapman remains unwell. Please see a separate parentmail for further details with regard to this. Mrs Holloway is due to return to us in the week after Easter. We wish both a speedy recovery. Mrs Hobbs, our PPA teacher has been welcomed back with open arm this week following an extended maternity leave due to Covid-19. It has been well over a year since pupils saw her! Mrs Hobbs works on Wednesdays/Thursdays and will resume covering teachers' PPA after Easter.

It was a very busy week in school last week. Our School Councillors planted trees for the Queen's Jubilee Green Canopy Project. Residents from Greenhill Grange visited our school to plant the first tree with our School Councillors. Later in the day, the councillors visited the residential home to plant the second tree. This was a heartwarming experience and the councillors did our school proud. We even met a resident who went to Chapmanslade School herself! Also last week, Oak Class travelled to Matravers School to record songs for this year's virtual Lions Concert. I can report that the team at Newland Homes "LOVE" them and their new plan is to install them by the site entrance rather than in one of the show-home gardens, so that they're in a more prominent position for everyone to see as they enter. Wonderful! Finally, on Friday we raised £168 in support of Ukraine. What a fantastic amount, which has already been donated to this worthwhile cause.

We have made the decision to suspend attendance awards, which we usually give out at the end of each big term, for the remainder of the year. During our attendance monitoring, it has become clear that so many of our pupils have been impacted by Covid-19 related absence and it does not seem fair to hold this against them. I know that there are still some pupils who have 100% attendance since September, which is hugely impressive and we thank those pupils (and parents).

From myself and all of the staff at Chapmanslade, we wish you all a Happy Easter and hope that you and your families have a peaceful break.

### **General Notices**

#### Covid-19 Update

Following most recent guidance in the living with Covid plan, children and young people aged 18 and under who have a positive COVID test will be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for three days. Pupils are no longer expected to routinely test for COVID-19 to attend school. However if your child is unwell and has a high temperature they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. If a child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, slight cough who are otherwise well they should continue to go to school.

#### Dogs on the school drive

Following a recent Health and Safety review, we have been reminded that dogs should not be walked onto the school site, up the school drive. We ask that you can refrain from bringing our furry friends up the school drive during drop-off and pick-up.

#### **Nut Allergy Information**

Nuts are allowed in snacks and lunch boxes because there are no children or staff with serious nut allergies. #### **Driveway Safety**

Please use the church yard to access the school and Busy Bees Preschool when the main school gate is locked rather than walking up the steep school drive. This is particularly important before school when many children are going into Busy Bees Breakfast Club just as school staff are trying to turn and park cars in the narrow space available. Please help us to keep children and cars separate.

If you have any concerns at all about your child's academic progress or pastoral care, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher as soon as possible. The adults in your child's class will do everything they can to help. The quickest way to resolve any concerns is to speak in person to your child's class teacher.
