<u>Maths</u> -

In both Years 3 and 4, we are focusing on multiplication and division and the links these have with each other.

We look at multiplying a 2 digit by a 1 digit (Y3) and a 3 digit by a 1 digit (Y4) with exchange.

It is so important to learn times tables as this underpins so many areas of maths.
