### The Ten Commandments

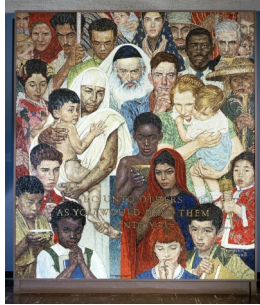
We explored the importance of rules, looking at the ten commandments God gave to Moses. We show respect by following rules.

We heard The Parable of the Talents, discussing how follow instructions given to us can show respect. The leader was upset with the man who wasted his talent.

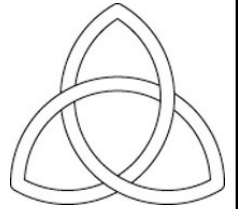
### School Rules
